


## Pepe Reginato

Pepe and his brother, Luis, grew up in the vineyards, learning the craft of making boutique, artisan sparkling wines from their father, José. The Reginato winemaking culture came to Argentina with their grandfather, an Italian immigrant who shared his love and knowledge of



wine with his children. In turn, José has passed his passion and know-how to his boys – Pepe attributes everything he has learned about wine to his father.
