ORIGINS



- Originated in Andalusia, Spain.
- Most likely named after a famous vintner 'Ximenez,' which was a common last name.
- Different from Pedro Gimenez grape, which is an indigenous Criolla grape from Argentina.
- Planted today in northern Chile.

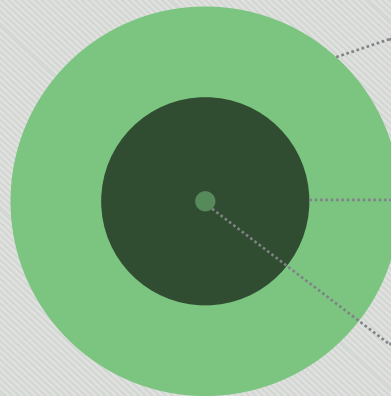


GRAPE FACTS

- Large bunches
 - Thick skinned berries
 - Non-uniform in grape size
 - Highly susceptible to botrytis & downy mildew
- (That's why it does well in the dry desert of Chile!)

MAYU PEDRO XIMENEZ

Made in Elqui Valley, Chile, adjacent to the **driest desert in the world**.

Mayu is named after the Inca word for the Milky Way's "river of stars".

65+ year-old vines at **6,320 feet**.

Dry and crisp with notes of citrus and a hint of white flowers. Refreshing acidity, minerality, and a long finish.
