


NEW CHILE

PEDRO XIMENEZ

ORIGINS



- Originated in Andalucia, Spain.
- Most likely named after a famous vintner 'Ximenez,' which was a common last name.
- Different from Pedro Gimenez grape, which is an indigenous Criolla grape from Argentina.
- Planted today in northern Chile.

Non-uniform in grape size




Highly susceptible to botrytis & downy mildew


