ESTATE WINE LINEUP:



AREYNA (\$15 SRP)

- Cabernet Sauvignon and Malbec that mark a moment in time in the evolution of the Lujan de Cuyo wine region. Areyna sparks the modern chapter of this region’s traditional past to unleash its full potential.

CASARENA ESTATE (\$20 SRP)

- Estate Cabernet Sauvignon and Estate Red Blend sourced from the winery’s Agrelo and Perdriel vineyards that focus on micro-terroirs and bring renewed excitement to the historic Mendoza winemaking region.

SINGLE VINEYARD (\$30 SRP)

- Owen’s Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon is born from 80+-year-old vines in a pergola trellising system planted in the 1930’s by an Italian immigrant family. Bold characteristics of dark fruit with savory notes and soft tannins.
- Naoki’s Vineyard Malbec is planted on a solitary plateau where there is an outcropping of chalk - “the most sought-after terroir in Mendoza these days” according to Luis Gutierrez. Complex and elegant.

WINEMAKER MARIANO QUIROGA ADAMO

- Rising star winemaker in Argentina.
- Mendoza native who spent the last few years as the head winemaker at El Porvenir in Salta.
- Named “Young Winemaker of the Year” at the Gaucho Annual Winemaker Awards in the UK.
- Bringing innovation and pushing the envelope to what is new and exciting in Argentina.
- “My mission is to let the Lujan de Cuyo terroir speak naturally through the wine.”
