

HERON



Heron relentlessly focuses on the best California appellations to create balanced, fresh classics that redefine approachability - embodying the determination of the iconic bird it represents and of Laely Heron, founder of one of the industry's first female-owned and-produced brands.

WHY DOES HERON STAND OUT?

- Laely Heron comes from a historic era of original female leaders who broke the glass ceiling in the wine industry by creating one of the first female owned and produced brands in 1995. With the debut of the 1994 vintage, Heron became an instant success by being poured in top restaurants and sold in boutique retail shops around the country.
- Heron wines are never formulaic each vintage of Heron reflects an exhausting search for the best grapes from the best appellations across California, to make the highest quality vintage expression that consistently showcases finesse, freshness, and balance.
- Longtime friends Laely and Nick Ramkowsky, owner of Vine Connections, have partnered to create the wines in Sonoma, California. Nick is a master blender who has worked for the past 25 years with South America's best winemakers to bring to life award-winning wines for the US palate.

SAUVIGNON BLANC: The wine shows classic Sauvignon Blanc character. Lemon lime and fresh cut grass. The finish is rich and more tropical with hints of mango and pineapple.

CHARDONNAY: Clean & fruit forward aromatics with pleasant varietal flavors like vanilla, stone fruit, and pineapple with a thick mouthfeel and fantastic lingering aftertaste.

PINOT NOIR: Generous aromas of strawberry and red cherries with perfumed, floral undertones and silky tannins.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON: The nose exudes generous aromas of strawberry, raspberries, red currant and black cherries with perfumed, floral undertones. Silky tannins yield a soft but persistent finish.

LAELY CABERNET: Red fruit meets dark fruit, great layers of cherry, blackberry and black currant with hints of cocoa. Tobacco and spice on the nose deepen the aromas. This wine has a beautiful, elegant structure and a finish that lingers.



HAYFORK



Hayfork emphasizes the importance of farming in winemaking and that the hands of the farmer in the field lay the foundation necessary to produce a quality wine.

WHY DOES HAYFORK STAND OUT?

- Napa winemaker Haley Wight is the 6th generation of her family to farm the Lewelling Ranch which sits at the base of the St. Helena foothills in the Napa Valley. Haley believes the farmer in the field lays the foundation to produce amazing wine.
- The Hayfork Cabernets comes from the same vineyard blocks every year, which is one of the oldest continuously owned and family-farmed pieces of land in the valley. The vineyard is one of the oldest continuously owned and family-farmed pieces of land in the Napa Valley.
- The name Hayfork has several personal meanings: a nickname Haley had as a child and a reference to the small town of Hayfork in the Trinity Mountains of Northern CA where the family spent time fishing. It is also a tribute to her farming background.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON: 6th generation Napa farmer Haley Wight proves that good quality wine starts in the farm with this refined Cab.

FIELD SELECT CABERNET SAUVIGNON: Expressive notes of chocolate, violets, graphite, and dried herbs lend complexity.

MARSANNE: Beautifully layered with notes of honeysuckle, tropical fruit, and citrus flower.

GRENACHE BLANC: This wine is an alpine meadow on a summer morning- pretty, sprightly, and refreshing.

CHARBONO: Easy and approachable with layers of earthy tannin flavors of wild raspberry, black plum, and bay laurel.

CARIGNAN: Once prolific in California, this now old-timey varietal harks back to the early 1900s.





Lewelling Vineyards celebrates over 150 years as one of the oldest continuously owned and farmed vineyards in the Napa Valley. The Wight family, 6th generation St. Helena vintners, produces exceptionally elegant and highly sought-after Cabernet Sauvignon.

WHY DOES LEWELLING STAND OUT?

- The historic Lewelling estate was established in 1864 near the western foothills in St. Helena by pioneer winegrower and horticulturalist John Lewelling. Over the years the family consistently harvested exceptional Cabernet Sauvignon grapes on the 28-acre vineyard that were sold to the most prestigious Napa Valley wineries.
- Today, each member of the family plays a pivotal role in crafting Lewelling Vineyards Cabernet Sauvignon. 5th generation brothers Doug, Dave and Alan oversee vineyard management, and Doug's daughter Haley joined the family business as winemaker with a degree in Earth Science and years of winemaking experience for her own label, Hayfork. She is among the 6th generation of the Lewelling family working on the ranch.
- The family is committed to making wines that showcase the exceptional fruit from this unique vineyard site. Gentle winemaking and minimal handling are emphasized to preserve the natural aromas and expression of the grapes which create some of Napa's most elegant Cabernets.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON: Full-bodied tannin, classic cabernet spice, and a dense texture create a multidimensional and layered wine.

WIGHT VINEYARD CABERNET SAUVIGNON: Single-vineyard estate Cab picked from the best block of Lewelling Ranch. Sumptuous aromas of berries, coffee and vanilla.









From father to son to brothers to cousins, the Giacosa family has passed down their talent making fascinating red wines in the Langhe region.

WHY DOES GIACOSA FRATELLI STAND OUT? -

- Giacosa Fratelli is a 5th generation, family-owned winery in Piedmont, Italy and is now led by Maurizio and Paolo Giacosa and Maurizio's twin sons, Alessandro and Mauro.
- The family farms 50 hectares across some of Piedmont's most prestigious wine regions, including Monforte d'Alba and Castiglione Falletto in Barolo and Neive in Barbaresco.
- The winery is a leader in sustainable winemaking, operating on solar power, capturing CO2 emissions, recycling rainwater for irrigation, and practicing organic farming.



GAVI: The Gavi territory is a hilly territory bordering Liguria. A fresh, light and dry white reminiscent of apples and white flowers.

ROERO ARNEIS: Produced from vineyards located in the Roero area of Piedmont on the northern bank of the Tanaro River, across the river from their home base of Neive, Barbaresco.

BARBARESCO BASARIN 'VIGNA GIANMATE': This Barbaresco comes from the Giacosa family's organic single vineyard Gianmate, located in the Basarin area, one of the most prestigious crus in Neive-Barbaresco.

DOLCETTO D'ALBA SARROCO: A light and bright Dolcetto with sweet raspberry and earthy notes hailing from Barbaresco's smallest region, San Rocco.

BARBERA D'ALBA BUSSIA: The Bussia cru is usually reserved for more premium Barolo, making this a unique and high quality Barbera.

NEBBIOLO D'ALBA: Harvested from select vineyards on the northern bank of the Tanaro River, aged 10 months in large oak barrels and a year in bottle to allow for the flavors and complexity to properly blend and mature.



BAROLO: Combining the family's various Barolo sites, with Bricco San Pietro (Monforte) the largest component. This Barolo DOCG reflects the family's signature style with fragrant aromas of rose petals, leather and tar. Matured in large wooden casks for two years and one year in the bottle, its a wine well suited to aging.



BAROLO BUSSIA: At the heart of Barolo production in Monforte d'Alba, from the prestigious Bussia cru, one finds the family's organic, hillside vineyards undulating below their historic stone cottage Cascina Canavere.



BAROLO SCARRONE 'VIGNA MANDORLO': One of only three producers making Barolo in Scarrone di Mandorlo within Castiglone Falletto. These hilltop, steep organic vineyards are closest to the village and named after the Almond trees that thrive here. The varied soils yield Nebbiolo of depth and intensity combined with elegance.



BAROLO SCARRONE 'VIGNA MANDORLO' RISERVA: One of only three producers making Barolo in Scarrone di Mandorlo within Castiglone Falletto. These hilltop, steep organic vineyards are closest to the village and named after the Almond trees that thrive here. The varied soils yield Nebbiolo of depth and intensity combined with elegance.

GRIGNANO



Situated in the heart of Chianti Rufina, a historic winemaking area among the most important in Tuscany.

WHY DOES GRIGNANO STAND OUT?

- The Grignano estate began in the middle ages and was once the personal property of Catherine of the Medici in the 15th century. The Ingharami family, also one of the finest shirt makers in Italy, have been the custodians for over 50 years.
- The estate is one of just 20 wineries in Chianti Rufina, an area known to produce distinctive, elegant, and age worthy wines due to maritime breezes and high elevation.
- Tommaso Ingharami is leading Grignano and his family's legacy into the future. "Thinking locally and acting globally", he is bringing back ancient traditions but with modernized labels that depict the windows and clocktower of the estate. He is producing a lower alcohol, fresher style of Chianti incorporating more Tuscan oak, terracotta and cement while maintaining low yields and the highest quality.

CHIANTI RUFINA: Tommaso aims for his Chianti to taste more of Sangiovese than oak. Made with Sangiovese, Canaiolo and other traditional varietals from their organic Rufina vineyards.

CHIANTI RUFINA RISERVA: Harvested from 2 hectares of the Poggio Gualtieri home vineyard in Pontassieve from organic certified, south-east facing vines.

VINSANTO DEL CHIANTI: Naturally air dried Trebbiano and Malvasia del Chianti aged 5 years in small barrels make this beautifully expressive yet well priced Vin Santo.



- Palazzo -



Third generation, family-owned, boutique winery located on a picturesque farm on the southeastern slope of Montalcino.

WHY DOES PALAZZO STAND OUT? -

- The Loia Family farms 4.2 hectares organically on the rocky Galestro soils of the southeastern hillside of Montalcino, in the heart of Brunello.
- Despite reduced aging requirements and trends toward barrique, next generation siblings Elia and Angelo continue to age their Brunello for 3 to 4 years in large Slavonian oak casks and further in bottle to produce elegant, drinkable wines upon release.
- All the vineyards surround the winery and are certified organic. Production is limited, with just 20,000 bottles produced each year. The most limited is the Cosimo, named after Elia's father and his legacy. Palazzo is the maiden name of Elia's mother, who still tends to the vineyards in her old age.

ROSSO DI MONTALCINO: Declassified Brunello grapes from the Palazzo estate vineyards, this production of the Rosso is very limited. *Certified Organic*

BRUNELLO DI MONTALCINO: A traditional-style Brunello from Palazzo's 4 hectares of sloped estate vineyards in the southeast of the appellation. From organic, galestro-rich soils and aged for 3 years in Slavonian oak before extended bottle aging.

BRUNELLO DI MONTALCINO RISERVA: Made only in the best years, this Brunello Riserva is aged 4 years in larger barrels before bottling aging. Their certified organic, hillside vineyards are rich in galestro-soils and directly surround the winery.

BRUNELLO DI MONTALCINO 'COSIMO': An elegant Brunello dedicated to the memory of the founder, Cosimo Loia, who strongly believed in the potential of the vineyards in Montalcino. Made only in the best vintages, the grapes for this wine are harvested from the first vineyard planted by Cosimo in 1985.





Produced from the Grignano estate which has been owned by the Inghirami family since the early 1970's.

WHY DOES PIETRAMAGGIO STAND OUT?

- Pietramaggio is Tommaso Inghirami's Chianti Classico expression, from their own high altitude, low yielding vineyard at the top of Greve, overlooking the Appennine mountains.
- The family owns and farms 50 organic-certified hectares with a focus on high altitude, cooler sites to preserve freshness in the wines. Pietramaggio is produced from the Grignano estate, which has been owned by the Inghirami family since the early 1970's, and the Medici family originally.

TOSCANA IGT 'SETA': A wonderful value Tuscan blend of Sangiovese, Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot from Grignano's home Rufina vineyards.

CHIANTI CLASSICO: The Inghirami family's Chianti Classico expression, incorporating high-altitude organically farmed Greve vineyards that give a freshness to the Sangiovese.

CHIANTI CLASSICO RISERVA: A powerful yet energetic Riserva with 18 months of aging.



URLARI



Urlari combines the best of old-world traditions and new-world innovation to create a unique experience of Tuscany meets Bordeaux.

WHY DOES URLARI STAND OUT? -

- Produced by esteemed Bordeaux winemaker, Jean-Philippe Fort and founders Mary Kate Buckley (United States), Roberto Cristoforetti (Italy) and Hugo Maurstad (Norway), Urlari brings world wine cultures of Italy, France & America together to create high quality wines.
- The brand has 10 hectares just 4 miles from the Tyrrhenian Sea. The orientation of the vineyards is the best kept secret for world-class Merlot and Sangiovese.
- The name, Urlari, comes from the Italian verb "Ulare" meaning to yell or howl and is an homage to allied WWII troops that used the land for hiding and communicated through yells or "Ulare".

PERVALE: A well-structured, elegant Super Tuscan blend that showcases beautiful acidity reflective of its remote, steep hillside vineyard on the Etruscan sea.

L'URLO: A world-class Merlot that embodies the elegance of Tuscany and stands up against some of the best Merlots in the world.

ORTUS SOLIS: In the tradition of some of the region's greatest wines, Ortus Solis is a blend of Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc made only in the best vintages.







Val des Rois, or 'Valley of the King,' is a single estate winery planted in 1965 by 9th generation Burgundian winemaker Romain Bouchard that sits on the northern edge of Southern Côtes de Rhône in Valréas, producing some spectacularly unique wines that are significantly higher in natural acidity than typical of the Southern Rhone.

WHY DOES VAL DES ROIS STAND OUT?

- Val des Rois translates to "Valley of the King" and is nestled in the hills outside of Valréas in Southern Rhône.
- 9th generation winemaker, Romain Bouchard started Val des Rois in 1965 after venturing from Burgundy to plant in Valréas. The Bouchard family has deep roots in winemaking dating back to the 17th century.
- In 2020 winemaker Stéphane Vedeau partnered with Romain Bouchard's son, agricultural manager Emmanuel Bouchard.

BLANC: From an organic single vineyard in Valréas, a northerly Côtes du Rhône village known for limestone-clay soils. This Roussanne-based blend has a silky texture, mineral unertones and a floral bouquet. *Certified Organic*


LE PETIT ROY: A delicate Côtes du Rhône, full of freshness and vibrant fruit from the limestone-laced soils of this cooler nothern part of appellation. Gravity flow, naural winemaking and concrete aging add to its elegance.


LES ALLARDS: Les Allards is an organic single vineyard in Valréas planted on limestone-clay slopes with south-east exposure. A powerful, dark and gamey Grenache made with minimal intervention and no added sulfites. *Certified Organic*




















Rethinking the classic, historic wine regions of Lujan de Cuyo and Salta to reveal freshness and innovation.

WHY DOES AREYNA STAND OUT?

- Areyna wines are made using the highest-quality estate fruit for each varietal. With every sip, the winemaking and viticulture team strive to transport you to the time and place where the fruit was sourced.
- Dubbed the "punks of Luján" for their nonconformist outlook on winemaking in the region.
- Areyna loosely translates to "sand" in Spanish, referring to the grains of sand passing time through an hourglass. It also acknowledges the umbrella winery, Casarena, or "house of sand," relating to the 1930s winery made of sand-colored stone and the sandy soil

CABERNET SAUVIGNON: An expressive & honest Cabernet Sauvignon harvested from high quality fruit, from Casarena estate vineyards in Lujan de Cuyo.


MALBEC: Estate-grown Malbec from Mendoza's historic Lujan de Cuyo with impressive structure, lively acidity, and a lingering finish.

TORRONTES: A dry, aromatic white with a distinctive salinity. The grapes are harvested from a pergola style, high-altitude desert vineyard located in Cafayate (Salta), the 'Grand Cru' terroir for Torrontes.

Amayna creates its own category of a rich style of cool climate wines grown within 7 miles of the Pacific Ocean.

WHY DOES AMAYNA STAND OUT?

- Amayna was one of the first wineries to establish the Leyda appellation in the late 1990s when Garcés-Silva family recognized the incredible, overlooked potential of Chile's San Antonio coast for premium viticulture.
- Amayna's boutique, gravity-fed winery is designed for quality winemaking and environmental sustainability.
- The word "amayna" in Chile loosely translates to "the calm after the storm" that ominous yet peaceful feeling that you only experience around the ocean.

SAUVIGNON BLANC: Made from the Garces-Silva's family estate, the first vines to be planted in the Leyda Valley and farmed with regenerative organic principals. Ocean breezes bring a savory saline balance to the wine's intense fruit character.

PINOT NOIR: An elegant, world-class Pinot Noir from the Garces-Silva family's best vineyards overlooking the Pacific Ocean.



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BODINI



Expressive estate-grown wines that impress any palate and showcase the unique winemaking region of Mendoza.

WHY DOES BODINI STAND OUT?

- Estate fruit is hand-harvested from Luján de Cuyo, highlighting the region's high-elevation desert, long sunny days, cold nights, low humidity, and natural irrigation from glacial snowmelt from the Andes Mountains.
- Winemaker Jimena Lopez (Graffito) has made wine for over 18 years all around the world. She is passionate and dedicated with tenacious drive and unmatched attention to detail.
- A brand new wine, Bodini Rosé of Malbec, was launched in 2017 to demonstrate the varietal's versatality.

MALBEC: Approachable and energetic estate Malbec at an unbeatable price. Notes of plum, blackberries and spice are balanced in this fresher, vibrant style of Malbec.

ROSÉ OF MALBEC: A bright and clean, medium-bodied wine that demonstrates the Malbec grape's unique expression as a rosé wine.





Grapes grown on oceanside vineyards on the Leyda coast, Boya (or buoy in Spanish) is bursting with fresh fruit flavors & brisk acidity.

WHY DOES BOYA STAND OUT?

- Boya vineyards are some of Chile's closest vineyards to the ocean, located five miles from the coast with direct exposure.
- Early harvest and young vineyards provide vibrancy and freshness in the wines.
- Using New World clones grown on selected soils (high iron and calcium carbonate) provides the freshest style.

PINOT NOIR: A coastal, approachable Pinot Noir that melds lively acidity with bright red fruits from the Garces-Silva family's organic, estate vineyards.

SAUVIGNON BLANC: A coastal, aromatic and herbaceous Sauvignon Blanc from the Garces-Silva family's organic, estate vineyards.

ROSÉ: Mostly Pinot Noir and a touch of Grenache, this rosé refreshes the palate with flavors of raspberry and tangerine with a mineral finish that begs for another glass.



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CASARENA



Casarena is rewriting the story of Luján de Cuyo by focusing on terroir diversity and discovering hidden gems in their estate vineyards.

WHY DOES CASARENA STAND OUT?

- The winery is committed to cultivate, study, and stay true to its place in Luján, constantly searching for micro-terroir vineyards that tell the story of the land.
- Focused on Cabernet and Cabernet blends the true strength of the appellation and some of the oldest plantings in Mendoza.
- The name "Casarena" is a creative merging of the Spanish words "casa" (house) and "arena" (sand), and is a tribute to their restored 1930s winery made of sand-colored stone and the sandy soil that their estate is built on.

LAUREN'S VYD. CABERNET FRANC: An expressive & elegant Cabernet Franc from Agrelo, one of Mendoza's top terroirs for Cabernet Franc.

OWEN'S VYD. CABERNET: Single vineyard estate-grown Cabernet Sauvignon from the best block of this 80-year-old pergola style vineyard, planted with original vines and roots.

NAOKI'S VYD. MALBEC: This single vineyard wine comes from a newly discovered terroir - an untouched plateau rich with Indian cement that imparts a unique minerality to the usually fruity varietal.

WHY DOES CASA SILVA STAND OUT?

- Casa Silva is a multi-generational, family owned and run winery with all members living locally in Colchagua.
- All grapes are estate grown and only from the Colchagua Valley.
- Casa Silva runs the highest level of research and development in Chile for Carmenere including new vineyard plantings, soil research, and clonal studies.

SAUVIGNON GRIS: A rarely-seen varietal harvested from vines planted in 1912 with beautiful elegance and balance.

CARMENERE TERROIR DE FAMILIA: Previously known as Cuvee Colchagua, the Carmenere Terroir De Familia is made from Casa Silva's Los Lingues vineyard and elevates the conversation about value Carmenere.

CARMENERE LOS LINGUES: A single-vineyard wine showcasing Colchagua's best expression of Carmenere.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON LOS LINGUES: A single-vineyard wine showcasing Colchagua's best expression of Cabernet Sauvignon.

S38 CABERNET SAUVIGNON: S38 marks a single, small soil block in Casa Silva's iconic Los Lingues vineyard. A world-class Cabernet Sauvignon with limited production.

MICROTERROIR: The result of groundbreaking research aimed at defining Carmenere's potential in Chile.

WHY DOES GRAFFITO STAND OUT?

- Winemaker Jimena Lopez handles all aspects of Graffito from vine selection to the final blend with a precise attention to detail.
- Jimena believes so deeply in her wine quality that she puts her fingerprint stamp of approval right on the label.
- After being a consulting winemaker in 7 countries for 18 vintages, Graffito is Jimena's first personal project. Her breadth of talent and experience ensures a bright future.

MALBEC: Small-production Malbec made by one-woman-show, Jimena Lopez, from vines with amazing concentration, aromatics, and earthy undertones.

CABERNET FRANC: Winemaker Jimena Lopez made this wine to experiment with one of her favorite varietals. Balanced and elegant with a distinctive spice from the Cabernet Franc varietal.









J. Bouchon shares their French and Chilean heritage through their wines made with Bordeaux varietals plus Chile's Carmenere, Carignan and Pais from the best vineyard blocks in Maule.

WHY DOES J. BOUCHON STAND OUT?

- J. Bouchon's Canto Norte blend represents their French ancestry (Merlot/Cabernet Sauvignon/Cabernet Franc), and the Canto Sur blend represents their Chilean roots (Carmenere/Carignan/old vine Pais).
- J. Bouchon's fresh, unoaked blends show natural structure and character of the vineyards.
- J. Bouchon's Block Selection Cabernet is harvested from Maule's most premium vineyards.

CANTO SUR: A blend that echoes Chile's historic and signature varietals, blending Carmenere, Carignan, and old-vine Pais.

CABERNET SAUVIGNON: Specific block selections blend together for a Cabernet Sauvignon that structurally speaks to the terroir complexity of Maule.

PAIS SALVAJE: Never been touched by the human hand, these Pais vines grow wildly in the trees next to the vineyards. 100% organic, 100% dry-farmed, 100% wild.

PAIS SALVAJE BLANCO: The rare white Pais. Harvested from the wild pais trees that mutated to blanco, then aged in an ancient tinaja (clay amphora) with native yeast with no filtration.

PAIS VIEJO: Made with Pais grapes from over 100-year-old Gobelet vines planted in the dry-farmed, coastal region of Maule.











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La Posta, or tavern, celebrates Argentina's best small family growers who meet at the end of the day to share a story and a glass of Malbec.

WHY DOES LA POSTA STAND OUT? -

- La Posta's 3 single-vineyard Malbecs, named after the grower families, demonstrate the wide range of Malbec flavor profiles provided by distinct Mendoza appellations.
- Laura Catena and winemaker Luis Reginato create complex and approachable wines that truly overdeliver in both presentation and quality.
- La Posta's award-winning packaging offers an intimate connection to these family growers with an invitation to "raise your glass" and join their experiences.

TINTO RED BLEND: This complex table blend of Malbec, Syrah, and Bonarda is perfect by the glass, but you'll want it by the bottle.

PIZZELLA MALBEC: 'Enjoy the simpler times' in La Consulta, Uco Valley with the Pizzella family's single vineyard Malbec, full of dark fruit, smoke and spice from nearly 4,000 feet of altitude.

PAULUCCI MALBEC: 'Find your passion' with the Paulucci family, former Sicilian mechanics turned Argentine farming family, whose single vineyard Malbec yields a wine full of vibrant red fruit and minerality, classic of this mountainous Lujan de Cuyo site.

FAZZIO MALBEC: 'Never slow down' and dance in Tupungato with Domingo Fazzio. His single vineyard Malbec is full of supple tannins, red currant, and mocha notes.

ARMANDO BONARDA: 'Raise your glass' to Estela Armando and her grandfather's half-century old Bonarda vineyard. This unique wine is lighter bodied than Malbec but with dark blueberry, dried herb and smoky aromas.



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Laura Catena's ultra-premium, boutique Luca wines make history with groundbreaking work in cultivating small-grower relations, sourcing premier old-vine Malbec, and mastering non-Malbec varietals.

WHY DOES LUCA STAND OUT?

- As a wine industry leader, mother of three, author, and ER doctor, Laura's relentless determination to excel at all aspects of her life is embodied in her Luca wines.
- Laura pioneered the fostering of small-family grower relations, allowing her to gain access to some of Argentina's best old-vine, low-yield, high elevation Malbec vineyards.
- Luca made history as the first to plant Pinot Noir and Chardonnay at over 4,500 feet the highest elevations in Mendoza for these varietals. Located in Gualtallary, they called the vineyard the G-Lot.

OLD VINE MALBEC: Luca is the first Argentine winery to bottle all of its Malbec exclusively from old vines. According to Laura Catena and Luis Reginato, old vines have great genetic diversity and make some of the most graceful, unforgettable wines.

MALBEC, PARAJE ALTAMIRA: This limited-edition Malbec imported for restaurants and wine bars is from the newly designated sub-appellation Paraje Altamira in the Uco Valley.

CHARDONNAY: The perfect balance between a Burgundian and California-style Chardonnay from the famous "G-Lot" in Gaultallary, at an extreme 4,900 feet altitude. Widely considered among the very best premium Mendoza's white wines.

PINOT NOIR: Planted in 1994, this vineyard defined a new terroir for Pinot Noir. This wine's elegant, perfumed style is full of tension and makes it one of Argentina's leading and highest-regarded Pinots.

BESO DE DANTE: An homage to the original Bordeaux blend of Malbec and Cabernet, this powerful wine has gripping tannins and great freshness and length.

NICO: An iconic 100% old-vine Malbec from the 80 year-old Rosas Vineyard in the Uco Valley. Carlos Rosas sadly sold his vineyard site to a developer to build homes, but not before he gave the old vines themselves to Laura.

UNUS: An iconic small-batch blend of Malbec, Cabernet Sauvignon and Petit Verdot planted from the best lots of the 1928 and Perdriel vineyards.

FINCA REMOTA: From 60+ year-old vineyards at the 'Faraway Ranch' in Altamira (Uco Valley), this dense Malbec is full-bodied with enticing floral aromas and black fruit flavor.
